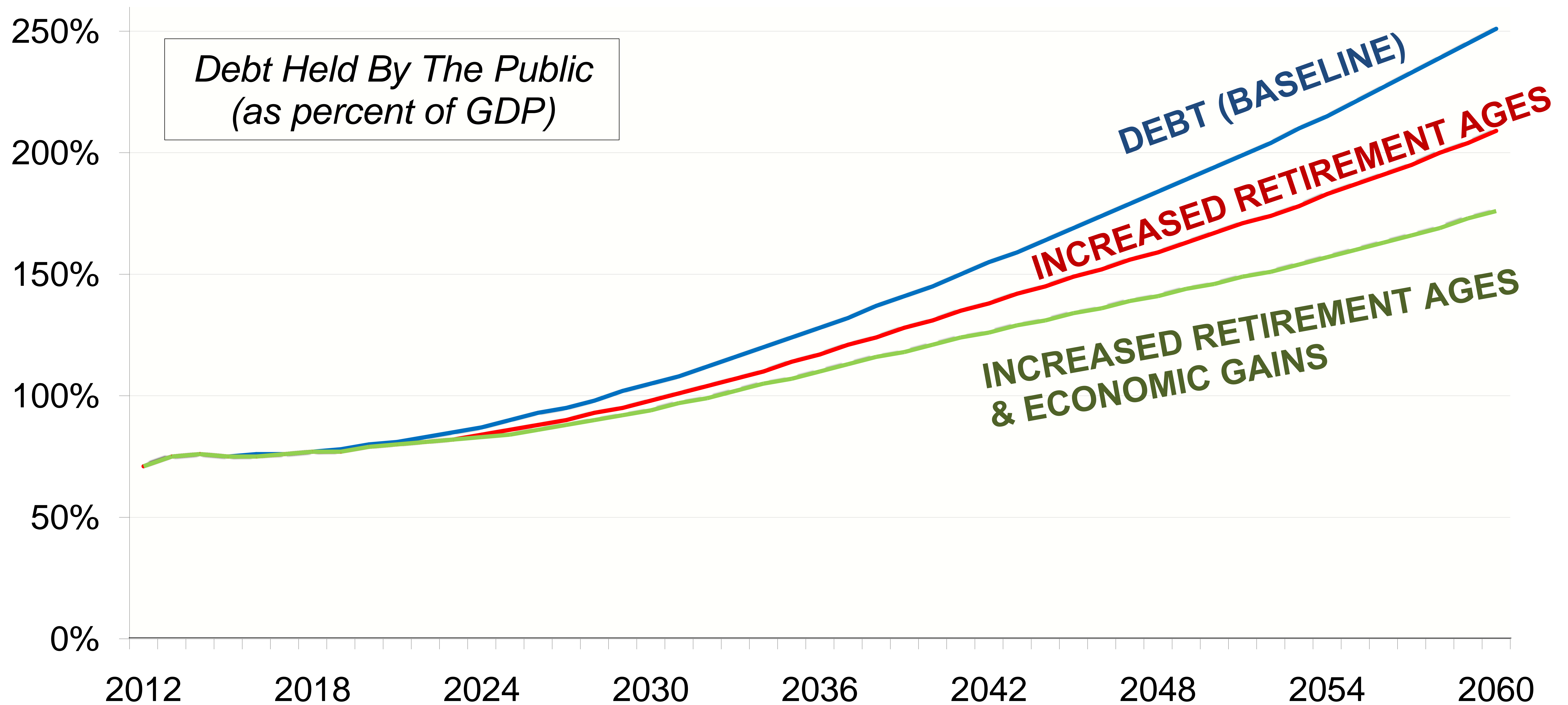


# Raising the Ages of Eligibility for Medicare and Social Security Reduces Long-Term Fiscal Imbalances
